Scope: This Policy applies to all employees, suppliers, visitors, vendors, and contractors.

Monitoring and Reporting

Employees are responsible for reporting any safety concerns or incidents to their supervisor immediately. All incidents, no matter how minor, must be reported to the Safety Department. Failure to report an incident may result in disciplinary action.

The Safety Department will investigate all reported incidents and determine the root cause. Corrective actions will be implemented to prevent future incidents. Employees who report safety concerns in good faith will be protected from retaliation.
