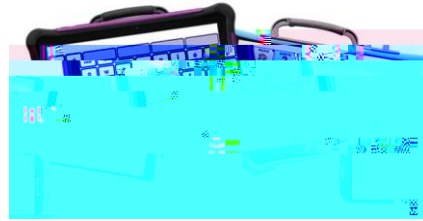




Port Phillip Specialist School recognises the importance for all children to have access to an appropriate communication system. An appropriate communication system is defined as one which is:

- deemed both appropriate and accessible to the child.
- available to the child in all their communicative environments.

- The device will be returned to you in the durable cover provided at the end of the school day.



- The expectation on Families is that the device will arrive to school charged and in a durable, protective cover.
- Personal insurance is highly recommended for any electronic systems entering school premises given these are not covered by the Department of Education and Training. Port Phillip Specialist School will not accept any responsibility for damages or loss of a device.
- Backing up the device is a Family responsibility and regular back-ups are highly recommended to avoid loss of data.
- School Speech Pathologists are able to work as part of your child's team to support the use of the device at school.
